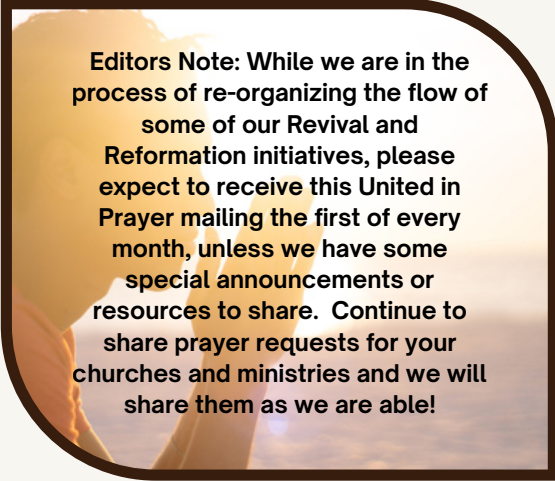


Testimonies from Ten Days of Prayer

World Church Prayer Requests

- **United States:** Pray for the members of the Walla Walla Eastgate SDA Church. Pray that the Holy Spirit will be poured out to give members a desire and ability to unite in prayer. Pray that as they realize the time is short, they will engage even more in prayer and soul-winning for heaven.
- **Jamaica:** Pray for the Shortwood SDA Church as they celebrate their 80th Anniversary. Pray that the Holy Spirit will fill the members to do the Lord's work. Pray for the pastors and other leaders that they will be faithful in surrendering daily to Jesus. And pray for the members, young and old, that they will open the door of their hearts to Jesus at all times.

- **South Africa:** Pray for the Aurum Adventist Academy. The new school year will begin on January 12 but the stakeholders will begin building a new building on January 2. Pray that the new building will be a place where the Spirit of peace can rest. Pray also that the students and staff alike will be blessed to be missionaries as they learn and work in the agricultural program.
- **Nigeria:** Pray for the registration of the Abuja Medical Missionaries with the Corporate Affairs Commission. This has been a process over two years in the making. Pray that God will open the doors for continued ministry in and through this group.
- **United Kingdom:** Pray for the Sale West SDA Church as they seek to minister to the needs of lonely people in their community. Loneliness is as bad for your health as smoking up to fifteen cigarettes a day, increasing the risk of heart attack, stroke, depression, and cognitive decline. Pray that the members of this church will be the hands and feet of Jesus as they seek to be a friend to those around them.
